There will be the words said by actors on the screen. Everyone can see the words.



Hearing Loop

This helps you hear when you have hearing aids.



Touch

There are things you can touch in the show.

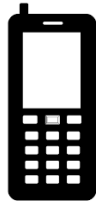
There are things you can hear.

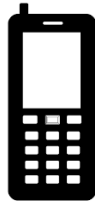
